The End Times and the Anointing

1 John 2:20-25

BIBLICAL BACKGROUND OF 'ANOINTING'

- 1. Anointing in the Old Testament. Ref. Psalm 89:20
 - Anointing (pouring on of water or oil) was used to consecrate someone or something for special purpose.
 - OT prophets were anointed by God for the purpose of proclaiming truth; Is. 61:1
 - OT priests were anointed by God for the purpose of service in the temple; Ex 29:1-9; 40:15; Ps 133
 - OT kings were anointed by God for the purpose of ruling as God's viceroy; 1 Sam 16:13; 15:17; 24:10

2. Anointing in the New Testament

- Anointing with oil for those who are sick. Mark 6:13; James 5:14 I.e., set apart in prayer for healing
- The 'anointing in the NT mostly refers to the Holy Spirit. Gk. χρισμα shows possession of the Holy Spirit
- Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit. See Acts 10:34-38
- Christ = Messiah = 'Anointed One' (Therefore, Christians = 'little anointed ones')
- God anointed believers with the Holy Spirit at the time of our conversion. 1 Cor. 2:12-13; 2 Cor. 1:21-22

'YOU HAVE AN ANOINTING' v.20-21

- 1. 'Anointing' as a noun is only used 2 X's in NT—both are in 1 John 2: v.20 and v.27.
- 2. The anointing (HS) is introduced in contrast to the antichrist. v.20a: But you have been anointed...
 - → The idea is: 'the antidote for the antichrist is the anointing'
- 3. The anointing (HS) is in all believers. v.20b: ...and you all have knowledge.
 - Not limited to an elite few; remember context of 1 John. Ref. Acts 2:14f & Joel 2:28-32
- 4. The anointing (HS) gives truth and reveals lies. v.21 Ref. John 14:18; 16:13
- → Summary idea: God has equipped us for the battle. We have what we need—the Holy Spirit!

THE HEART OF THE HERESY. v.22-23

- 1. The heart of the heresy is denying that Jesus is the Christ. v.22b ...he who denies that Jesus is the Christ
 - This means either denying that Jesus is fully God or denying that Jesus is fully man.
 - The Bible teaches that Jesus Christ is one person with two natures.
- → Nearly every cult, heresy today is essentially a distortion/perversion of this truth.
- 2. Denying that Jesus is the Christ is believing a lie. V.22a Who is the liar but he who denies....
 - This includes denying any part of Christ's person or work.
- 3. Denying that Jesus is the Christ is diabolical—it is linked with the antichrist. v.22c
 - -v.22c: Who is the liar but he who denies that Jesus is the Christ? This is the antichrist...
 - It is diabolical because it strikes at the very heart of the Gospel and what happened on the cross.
 - Jesus <u>had</u> to be fully God and fully man in order to reconcile a Holy God with sinful man. Rom 3:26
- 4. Denying that Jesus is the Christ is a rejection of God Himself. v.23a Ref. John 5:32; 8:19; 14:7
 - -v.23a: No one who denies the Son has the Father...
 - The effect of denying Christ = rejecting the Father. Lk 10:16; Jn 15:21
- → Note: inclusiveness of v.20-21 (all believers have HS); exclusivity of v.22-23 (only those with Christ know God)

APPLICATION: THE BELIEVER'S PROTECTION & PROMISE. v.24-25

- 1. This message was not new to these believers. v.24: Let what you heard from the beginning abide in you...
- **2. Let these truths abide in you. v.24** ("abide" is used 3 times in this verse)
 - To 'abide' or 'remain' shows continuing relationship. Abode: to take up residence; 'The place where I live.'
- 3. Confessing that Jesus is the Christ is the way to have eternal life. v.25

Antichrist → **Antidote**: **Anointing** → **Abiding**

Matthew 10:32-33: Therefore everyone who confesses Me before men, I will also confess him before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, I will also deny him before My Father who is in heaven.
