"Cleaning House"

Judges 6:25-40

BACKGROUND OF THIS STORY

- 1. Judges 2:6-15: The grief & tragedy of a generation who does not know the LORD.
- 2. Judges 6:1-10: The Midianites oppressed Israel. Sin plunders us the same way.
- 3. Judges 6:11-24: The LORD visits Gideon, hears his cry and calls him a "mighty man of valor." v.12
 - Gidon doesn't see himself the same way: "my clan is the weakest...and I am the least." v.15
 - "The LORD is with you.... But I will be with you." v.12,16

GIDEON GETS HIS HOUSE IN ORDER (BY DESTROYING THE ALTAR OF BAAL) v.25-27

- 1. The LORD told Gideon to tear down the altar of Baal & replace it with an altar to the LORD. v. 25-26
 - Pull down the altar of Baal & cut down the Asherah that went with it. v.25
 - The Asherah was a wooden pillar/pole representing a sacred tree (from the Canaanite pagan religion).
 - Build an altar to the LORD your God and give a burnt offering on it. v.26
- 2. Gideon did what the LORD commanded. v.27
 - Narrator note: But because he was afraid of his family and the men of the town he did it by night.

GIDEON GETS A NEW NAME—"JERUBBAAL" (AND SOME NEW ENEMIES IN HIS HOME TOWN) v.28-32

- 1. The men of the town were not happy that their altar of Baal was pulled down. v.28-29
- 2. They sought out Gideon to kill him. v.30-31
 - Gideon's father, Joash, reasoned with the men: If Baal is truly a god, let Baal kill Gideon.
- 3. Gideon was called "Jerubbaal" = "Let Baal contend against him". v.32
- → Application: What spiritual truth is demonstrated here?
 - -6:24: "Gideon built an altar to the LORD and called it, The LORD Is Peace."
 - -6:25: Gideon pulled down the altar of Baal.
 - -6:26: Gideon built another altar to the LORD.
- -James 4:4: You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.
- -2 Timothy 3:12: Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted
- -Galatians 5:16: But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

GIDEON GATHERS AN ARMY (AND SOME ADDED ASSURANCE) v.33-40

- 1. The Midianites prepared another attack. v.33
 - They gathered with the usual crew (ref. 6:3) in the Valley of Jezreel.
- 2. Gideon also gathered an army to fight them. v.34-35
 - The Spirit of the LORD "clothed" Gideon and he sounded the trumpet to gather other tribes to fight.
- 3. Gideon sought assurance from God through 'the sign of the fleece.' v.36-40
 - Psalm 103:13-14: As a father shows compassion to his children, so the Lord shows compassion to those who fear him. For he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust.
